Friends,

Today marks the first Sunday in the season of Lent – a period of 40 days in which we prepare to hear again the story of Jesus's death and resurrection.

For some in our community, the practices and traditions of this season are familiar, having spent time worshipping within liturgical traditions or having engaged in personal spiritual disciplines during this time of year. For others, Lent is a mystery, often not part of a Baptist church upbringing, or "free church" practices. For some, it sounds unnecessarily dour or punitive, evoking memories of harsh versions of the faith, or suggesting that sacrifice, rather than flourishing is the stuff of the Christian life.

This season of Lent we invite you simply to a couple of things we hope and pray will deepen your faith. None are designed to be punitive. All are intended as life-giving.

Our teaching series we explore the parables of Jesus. We invite you to read them prior to each service as part of your own spiritual practice. On 4 Sundays there will be an opportunity to engage in bible study and discussion after the morning service on level 4. These studies will invite you to delve more deeply into the reading featured in the worship service. Lastly, you may choose to take up or give up a practice or habit during this time. Some engage in a traditional practice of fasting. Others give up alcohol or facebook or coffee. Some choose to take up a practice of service or an action toward social justice. None of this suggests that we earn favour with God through such actions. Instead, we choose to be especially intentional in our living, recognizing that things that often claim to bring joy, peace or fulfillment are not the ultimate sources of our life. We give them up in order to focus on what is more true, more full of life, more joyful.

Please join us on this solemn but ultimately satisfying journey.
